Frequently Asked Questions

Edition 2016-2017: Climate change

Who can enter year two of the Prize?

The Prize is open to natural persons aged 18 or over resident in any country, regardless of nationality. You can enter individually or as a group. Non-profit legal persons, resident in any country, may also enter, individually or as a group.

Must the project be specially created for this Prize?

No, the project submitted need not be specially created for the Prize. If the project is already under development or has been materialised, it must highlight any new features in its implementation and justify the awarding of the Prize.

Must I submit a project that coincides with one of the three spheres of activity listed (point 3 in the Rules of the call for entries)?

The Prize encompasses a wide range of proposals and is also open to new cultural ideas, all of which are valid provided they comply with the requirements described in the conditions of entry.

What format should I use?

The purpose of the Prize is to explore new cultural languages in the processes of research, design and production of contents. There is no set format or genre, but projects that incorporate emerging and integrative processes, hybrid formats and a mix of disciplines will be highly valued.

What projects are not accepted in this call for entries?

Projects that are merely commercial or for business will not be accepted in this call for entries.

Is the Beta Station the only space at the CCCB where I can set up my project?

The CCCB's Beta Station is available if the project calls for a physical space. However, other spaces on CCCB premises or elsewhere can also be used to complement the project. [See information about the Beta Station.](#)

Is the prize money of 20,000 € to carry out the project?

Yes, the prize money is awarded to carry out the winning proposal. This amount will be divided between fees and production costs (including travel and accommodation expenses, as necessary). Once the Prize has been awarded, a definitive estimate will be made with the assistance of the CCCB team to value the proposal's requirements.

Can I add other forms of funding to the budget?

The CCCB will award the winning proposal prize money of 20,000 €. If the winner has other justified forms of funding, it can be used to complement the budget.

Does the project have to be developed during the six months the exhibition is open?

The project must be carried out in a maximum of three months (January 2018 – March 2018), in the framework of the exhibition "After the End of the World". [See information about the exhibition.](#) According to the project's requirements, the proposal must be prepared in the months running up to this time. Once the prize has been awarded, a definitive calendar will be drawn up with the CCCB team to decide on the production and execution process.

How should I present my project, and how are the projects processed?

Projects must be submitted to the Prize via the website www.innovationcccb.org/registration. Projects submitted in a physical format will not be accepted. You must register on the website to be able to present your project. We recommend you consult the [registration guide](#) before registering.

What documentation about the project must I present?

The registration form comprises two sections: "Personal details" and "The project". In the project section, you must submit: the title of the project, a representative image, which language it is in, and the presentation of the project. To present the project, you must use the [project presentation form](#) attached here and fill in all the required fields. When completed, attach it in PDF format.

When is the deadline for presentation of my project?

Projects can be consulted, completed and modified until 31 January at 18:00 (CET). We recommend that you don't wait till the last minute to present your project, to avoid flooding the system and blocking your presentation. Think ahead!
